Pure Water for the World's mission is to improve lives by empowering people with access to life's most basic necessities...safe water and sanitation.



We do this by partnering with underserved communities, in Central America and the Caribbean, providing the tools and education to establish sustainable safe water, hygiene, and sanitation programs.



Dear Friends of PWW,

This year was impactful for PWW, as we reached >14,000 people in need. *We know that clean water alone is not enough.* Our complete WASH (water, sanitation, and hygiene) programs include clean water filters and latrines in homes and schools, handwashing stations in schools, laying pipes and building rainwater harvesting tanks for schools to have access to water, and providing comprehensive hygiene education programs to families, teachers, and the greater communities.

We doubled the number of WASH training program topics this year and, with this, more than doubled the number of people trained. We also conducted over twice the number of water quality tests, helping more people understand their water source.

This year we completed our first comprehensive WASH projects in Haitian schools, reaching >6,000 children, who previously had no safe water, no safe place to use the bathroom or manage menstrual cycles, and no way to wash hands at school.

We also hosted our biggest Menstrual Hygiene Day celebration to-date, with >1,000 children, teachers and parents participating in PWW activities to celebrate, learn and breakdown barriers. Education provides a powerful means to remove the stigma of shame and open doors for women and girls to be supported and respected. AND, it helps empower girls to stay in school!

We simply cannot do this without you. We are deeply grateful for your support. Our successes and everyday achievements are only possible because of the invaluable partnership we share. Looking forward to more impactful work to come, as we enter our 20th year! Thank you.

Water Quality Testing

732 Tests were conducted for a wide-variety of clients in Haiti, including other NGOs, governmental organizations and private businesses in our Water Quality Testing Lab.

In addition to the lab in Haiti, our teams in Honduras and Haiti regularly monitor communities served, testing source water, storage water, and filtered water to ensure that tools are working efficiently and effectively and communities are experiencing lasting impact.



WASH Training & Consulting Services

Education is the critical foundation to sustainable change.

With a commitment to expand our collective impact on the planet, by training others how to effectively implement safe water and sanitation programs, our **WASH (Water, Sanitation & Hygiene)** Training Teams doubled their reach this year.

We conducted **29** workshops, covering **19** WASH topics, and providing essentials skills to **703** individuals, representing a variety of organizations, including other NGOs, government agencies, private businesses, teachers. Trainees take lessons learned back to their respective communities.

This training approach allows us to reach significantly more communities with WASH programs. *The overall health benefits are multiplied exponentially.*

Volunteers Deliver Lasting Change

This year, 58 volunteers joined our teams in Haiti and Honduras, giving their all to make a difference.

They installed biosand water filters in family homes, dug trenches for PVC piping, built latrines and handwashing stations at schools, tested water sources, sifted sand, administered anti-parasite medications, got to know our local teams, and interacted with local children and families at their homes and schools.

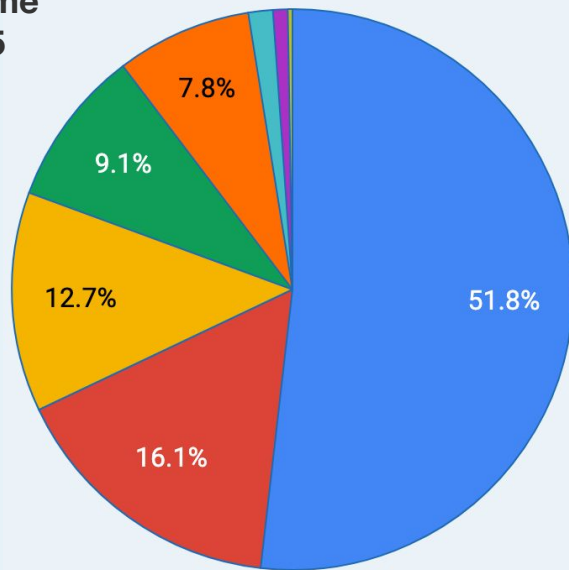

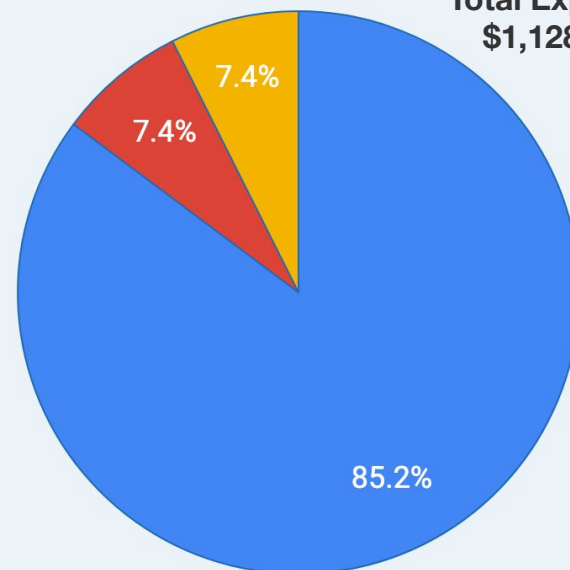
