Additional Notable Accomplishments of FY2022

- ◆ Welcomed **Matt Korn** as Executive Director.
- ◆ **PWW Haiti relocated** offices, moving from Port-au-Prince to Limonade, located near Cap-Haïtien in northern Haiti.
- ◆ **Completed 400-home safe water and WASH education project**, located in the Limonade region, funded by Rotary International and launched in 2021.
- ◆ **2022 Classy Awards Finalist**
 - *Health and Hope in Haiti* program recognized for its contribution to addressing the need for reliable access to safe water, sanitation and hygiene education (WASH) in homes, schools and clinics in underserved Limonade communities.
- ◆ PWW Honduras contracted by UNICEF to continue **Safe Spaces Program in Honduras schools**, aimed at supporting climate-resilient water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) in schools and communities.
 - The multi-year project reaches school-age children, fulfilling their right to education through safe learning spaces and contributing to the UN's Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 6, which is to ensure availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all.
 - Impact in FY2022 includes:
 - 1,187 teachers/school administrators trained on climate-resilient WASH practices with a gender approach, in contexts of water scarcity and COVID-19. This will benefit 4,495 students as well as future generations.
 - 16 schools have improved access to WASH facilities.
 - 65 schools conducted one (or more) interactive WASH and MHM activity(s).
 - Inaugural Learning Exchange held between teachers in 4 communities to share learnings, experiences, and activities related to WASH.
 - 5 schools created security plans related to WASH and climate change.
- ◆ PWW Honduras selected by UNICEF to provide **WASH services as part of its continued humanitarian response for migrants** in Honduras, including:
 - Hygiene kits for 2,581 individuals.
 - Improved access to WASH services, including menstrual hygiene management and COVID prevention, in 3 temporary shelters, 4 educational/temporary shelters, and one safe space for children, benefiting 5,919+ individuals, including 1,450+ children.
 - Installed water storage tanks and provided capacity building in 2 temporary shelters.
 - Provided improved water and sanitation facilities to a new safe space in a school.
 - In collaboration with SANAA (Honduras water organization), provided support to local government on the development of a multi-sector contingency plan.
- ◆ **Hosted second annual H2O=Health, Hope & Opportunity World Water Day Virtual Auction**, raising \$8,117, which was matched 100%, resulting in \$16,234 supporting WASH programs in Limonade, Haiti.
- ◆ Awarded **Guidestar's Platinum Level of Transparency**.
