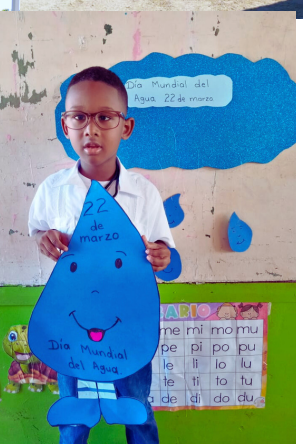

Honduras National Recognition & Impact. The Honduras national government adopted PWW's climate-resilient WASH guidelines and menstrual hygiene management program for all Honduran schools.

LIFE-Honduras Consortium. PWW joined United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), Action Against Hunger (Central America), ChildFund Honduras, Adventist Development & Assistance Resources Agency (ADRA), and Suffering Relief Foundation in the LIFE-Honduras Consortium, funded by U.S. Department of State: Bureau of Population, Refugees, and Migration. The Consortium addresses emergency response activities that cover the sectors of child protection, education, water, hygiene and sanitation, nutrition and health.

PWW addresses WASH relief and has helped 239,773 people since last July.

Service Trips. Trips began again, with 14 people traveling to Honduras to join the PWW team and community members in the field, learning the ins-and-outs of PWW WASH programs in homes, schools and health centers.

Community Mapping, Roucou. In collaboration with local leaders and the regional water authority, PWW Haiti completed a comprehensive Community Mapping of the Roucou Communal, located in the Limonade Region of Northern Haiti. With this information, PWW has developed a strategic roadmap for reaching all of the families in the Roucou Commune who currently lack reliable access safe water and essential sanitation and hygiene practices.

Community Education Program. PWW introduced the Community Education Program (CEP) in Limonade, Haiti. The CEP creates a pool of local WASH paraprofessionals, made up of community leaders. PWW selects, trains, and supports this group, known as Lead Community Agents (LCAs), to serve as local WASH leaders, knowledgeable about effective WASH practices and able to teach others in their community. PWW has trained nine (9) LCAs who have already delivered trainings to >500 individuals, including community members and students at local schools.

Empowering Women & Girls in Haiti. In celebration of Menstrual Hygiene Day 2023, PWW Haiti launched its inaugural Menstrual Hygiene Management workshop, incorporating the making of reusable sanitary pads. The workshop serves to improve the health, wellbeing, and dignity of women and girls by providing them with the knowledge, skills, and resources needed to safely, effectively manage menstruation.

High Marks! PWW was awarded the highest accolades from charity watchdogs, once again receiving accreditation from the BBB's Give.Org; achieving Platinum status with Guidestar/Candid; and securing 4-stars from Charity Navigator.
